## **Crisis Services** (630) 627-1700

The Crisis Center is a mental health support system that deals with mental health emergencies on a 24-hour a day basis. This center deals with urgent mental health issues that require immediate attention such as suicidal thoughts, homicidal threats, and symptoms of serious mental illnesses including depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, anxiety disorder and issues that may require hospitalization.

Individuals in need can contact the Crisis Intervention Unit at any time and set up an interview either by phone or in person. If necessary, the Crisis Residential (Respite) program has up to ten beds available for short term crisis stabilization.

Psychiatric evaluations and short term crisis counseling intervention are also available on a scheduled basis if needed.

## Child and Adolescent Services

The goal of the Child and Adolescent Program is to strengthen the functioning of families by assisting a child or adolescent with emotional problems. The array of services includes:

- Consultation to schools and youth serving organizations
- Services for the mentally ill/substance abusing individual
- Psychiatric and psychological evaluations
- Group, individual and family counseling
- Linkage to community resources
- Wraparound planning and service coordination
- Crisis intervention
- Parent education and support
- Assistance with Individual Care
- Grant Program (ICG)
- Screening, Assessment and Support Services (SASS)

Treatment services are provided at the Public Health Centers, in homes, schools and in the community.

## **Adult Services**

The goal of Adult Services is to preserve and promote the emotional well-being of DuPage County residents who have mental illness or are mentally ill and substance abusing. A variety of programs are offered to those individuals who have experienced psychiatric illnesses and are attempting to live independently in the community. Clients receive an array of services that may include:

### Outpatient

- Educational classes
- Group, individual and family counseling
- Psychiatric and psychological evaluation
- Medication management
- Case management and Intensive Case Management
- Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Community based intensive case management which enables clients to live as independently as possible in the community, provides alternatives to psychiatric hospitalization and reaches out to the homeless mentally ill.
- Probation Case Management
- Mentally III Court Alternative Program (MICAP)
- Vocational
- Crisis Residential
