## PRESS RELEASE Aggravated Robbery Arrest

**Wood Dale, IL** – The Wood Dale Police department has arrested the offenders responsible for an Armed Robbery that occurred on June 4, 2011 at approximately 9:45 pm. The victim in the incident was a pizza delivery driver who was approached by three offenders, one of which was armed with what was believed to be a handgun. The offenders had left the scene prior to the police department being contacted.

The investigation revealed that the suspects had ordered a pizza to be delivered to a residence in a townhouse area, and when there was no one home to take delivery, the driver was robbed of currency from his person at gunpoint when he returned to his delivery vehicle. The driver was not injured during the incident. It has since been learned that the weapon used in the crime was a pellet gun and it has been recovered.

Several leads were developed through interviews and neighborhood canvasses and the three suspects were identified. All three suspects were taken into custody between June 14<sup>th</sup> and June 17<sup>th</sup> without incident.

After further interviews, evidence collection and upon conferring with the DuPage County State's Attorney's Office, all three suspects were charged with Aggravated Robbery. Aggravated Robbery is a class 1 felony, punishable by up to 15 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections and up to a \$25,000 fine. Gahan has posted \$20,000 bond and is awaiting trial. Thonn and Grundy are currently being held in the DuPage County Jail. Thonn currently has a \$150,000 bail and Grundy has a \$100,000 bail.
