UNLAWFUL DELIVERY CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OBSTRUCTING A PEACE OFFICER

Wood Dale, IL – On July 22, 2010, the DuPage Metropolitan Enforcement Group (DuMEG), in cooperation with the Wood Dale Police Department, executed a search warrant at 411 N. Walnut Avenue in Wood Dale resulting in the arrest of 3 adults and 1 juvenile.

Based on information received from a concerned citizen about possible illegal prescription drug sales, an undercover investigation was started with DuMEG and the Wood Dale Police Department. This residence was the focus of a previous narcotics investigation involving the sale of morphine pills to a juvenile who had slipped into a coma.

During the course of the undercover investigation, several suspects were identified as being involved in the illegal sale of prescription medications. Based on the investigation and evidence obtained, a search warrant was executed without incident.

After conferring with the State's Attorney's Office, James Grzeca was charged with 2 counts of Unlawful Delivery of a Controlled Substance and Hellen A. Kollar was charged with 1 count of Unlawful Delivery of a Controlled Substance, class 3 felonies punishable by 2 to 5 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections and up to a \$25,000 fine. Hellen G. Kollar was charged with Obstructing a Peace Officer for allegedly attempting to prevent the arrest of her daughter, Hellen A. Kollar. Obstructing a Peace Officer is a class A misdemeanor. Charges are being sought against the juvenile through the State's Attorney's Office.

Members of the public are reminded that these complaints contain only charges and are not proof of the defendant's guilt. A defendant is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial in which it is the government's burden to prove his or her guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
