

ORDINANCE NO. O-23-016

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MASTER FEE SCHEDULE OF THE CITY OF WOOD DALE SPECIFYING THE FEES FOR CHAPTERS 4 AND 6 OF THE CITY OF WOOD DALE MUNICIPAL CODE PROHIBITING VEHICLE WORK AND MAINTENANCE ACTIVITY ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the City of Wood Dale (hereinafter referred to as the “City”) is a body politic and corporate, organized and existing pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the City possesses the authority, pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*, to adopt ordinances pertaining to public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City (hereinafter referred to as the “City Council”) is the corporate authority for the City and is authorized by law to exercise all powers and to control the affairs of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council possesses full power and authority to approve and pass all ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations necessary for carrying into effect the objects for which the City was formed, in accordance with the Illinois Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Code (the “Code”) currently regulates and controls all matters concerning the residential and commercial operations of streets, sidewalks and public ways within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that providing for the prohibition of certain activities within the streets, sidewalks and public ways of residential and commercial districts of the City would enhance public safety; and

WHEREAS, fines associated with certain activities upon City streets, sidewalks and public ways deter activity that threatens public enjoyment, safe ingress and egress of public safety emergency vehicles, and the City’s sewer system from unsafe pollutants; and

WHEREAS, the inclusion of fines against certain activities upon City streets and sidewalks, and means to enforce said prohibitions provide a deterrent and a mechanism to ensure the protection of the City’s residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to adopt and enforce fines for certain activities on public streets, sidewalks and public ways to effectuate and achieve compliance with the requirements of the Code; and

WHEREAS, Staff proposed certain amendments to Chapters 4 and 6 of the Code and the City’s master fee schedule in this Ordinance to accomplish said objective; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the proposed amendment to the master fee schedule and has determined that said amendment is in the best interests of the City and will help deter activities that impact the streets, sidewalks and public ways of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council believe it to be necessary and proper that the City Council adopt the amendment to the master fee schedule regarding Chapters 4 and 6 of the Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Wood Dale, DuPage County, Illinois, at a special meeting duly assembled, as follows:

SECTION ONE: That the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

SECTION TWO: That the City’s master fee schedule of the City of Wood Dale is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION THREE: That all ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR: That the City Manager, City Staff and City Attorney shall take all steps necessary or authorized to implement said provisions.

SECTION FIVE: That the City Clerk of the City of Wood Dale is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form, pursuant to the statutes of the State of Illinois.

SECTION SIX: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the manner provided by law.
