The City's new HVAC system at Public Works is a high-efficiency unit. In the last five years, the City has been awarded Earth and Water Quality Flags from School & Community Assistance for Recycling and Composting Education (S.C.A.R.C.E.). The City met specific requirements to achieve each flag.

THE INAUGURAL CITIZENS' **PUBLIC WORKS ACADEMY**

WAS A HUGE SUCCESS!

The City of Wood Dale held the inaugural Citizens' Public Works Academy in spring 2024. The four-week program gave an in-depth overview of the Department's five divisions: Administration, Streets, Utilities, Vehicle Maintenance and Wastewater. Highlights of the Academy included: tours of department facilities not normally viewed by the public, including the inside of a water tower and the North Wastewater Treatment Plant, and jumping in and riding in some of the "big trucks" - including the bucket truck!

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT IN WOOD DALE

The City of Wood Dale contracts with Clarke Environmental to provide mosquito abatement services for the Wood Dale community. The contractor performs multiple citywide sprayings each year as part of an integrated pest management plan that includes inspections, surveillance of mosquito populations, and treatments for both larval and adult mosquito control. The program does not eliminate all mosquitoes but controls the population to help prevent the spread of the West Nile Virus.





BE THE SOLUTION TO STORMWATER POLLUTION



As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. Stormwater can flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, or wetland. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water.


By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants like pesticides, pet waste, grass clippings, and automotive fluids off the ground and out of stormwater. Adopt healthy household habits and protect lakes, streams, rivers and wetlands. Remember to share these habits with neighbors!

The City's Public Works **Utilities Division flushes** water main lines through the fire hydrants throughout the summer. This process has several benefits for the water distribution system. Some of these benefits include verification of proper hydrant operation, confirming the available flow to the hydrants, allowing for the delivery of the highest quality water to all areas of the City, and removing mineral and sediment buildup from the water main lines. A Lifetime Worth of Training

Celebrating Two Great Members







Commissioner Jeffery Stanek

Recently the Wood Dale Fire Protection District had the opportunity to celebrate two of our amazing members. Trustee Ric Lindahl retired from his position after serving the district as a commissioner and then elected trustee for 29 years. Enjoy your retirement sir. Also, Jeffery Stanek was appointed to Commissioner. Commissioner Stanek served the WDFPD for 30 years, rising through the ranks from firefighter to Battalion Chief. He will now serve as a commissioner. Jeffery is one of 4 generations of the Stanek Family to serve The Wood Dale Fire Protection District.

Earlier this Spring, the Wood Dale Fire Protection District hosted 2 weeks of live fire training in the Mohawk Manor area. This is the third year in a row we have been able to execute this type of realistic training in acquired structures. Our training team and firefighters worked for months to prepare for this, from filing permits with the EPA and preparing the homes for safe training.

Over the course of 7 days, firefighters trained in fire suppression, ventilation, victim searches, overhaul, fire dynamics and behavior, and more. On the final day, BC Maderak and BC Hurst simulated 2 mock arson fires. These 2 fires were then used to train members of the DuPage County Fire Investigation Task Force. When it was all said and done, over 100 firefighters received the most realistic training available. Thank you to the: Bensenville FPD, Addison FPD, Itasca FPD, Villa Park FD, York Center FPD, Wood Dale Public Works, Wood Dale Police, and DuPage County Sheriffs all for helping and participating. Thank you to Jeffery Dublo and Lauren McDonald of TransWestern, who worked with our training team to make this happen, and for donating the structures that allowed for this amazing training.
