REPORT & RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVAL OF ZONING VARIATION TO ALLOW A 6' HIGH FENCE IN FRONT YARD AT 394 PRESERVE LANE - CASE NO. CDC-2021-04

DISCUSSION:

Director Cage reported this case went to CDC May 17, 2021. He reviewed the location, noting the petitioner also owns the conservation easement. He then reviewed what the City Code allows. The applicant is requesting a 6' feet solid wooden fence to the 25' foot mark along the property, and wrought iron for another 6' feet to leave the area more open. The neighboring property owner supports this request and CDC approved this 5-1. Sides will be 6 feet and anything past the 25' from the front of the property needs to use a picket fence unless there is a variance. Mayor Pulice expressed concerns about setting precedence for future requests and emphasized being consistent. Ald. Woods noted that a hardship is needed for a variation.

Ald. Sorrentino made a motion, seconded by Ald. Jakab, to approve a Zoning Variation to allow a 6' feet high wrought iron fence in the front yard of 394 Preserve Lane, Case No. CDC-2021-04. A roll call vote was taken with the following results:

DISCUSSION:

Director Wilson introduced Anthony Miceli from Speer Financial. Mr. Wilson explained there are three options to fund this project. It was originally designed to be a 4-5 year build-out in the CIP, but after discussions City Council intended they want to do this sooner than 5 years. Doing so will require bonding. It was noted it does qualify for the TIF. The Public Works building and land acquisition discussed are both in the existing TIF so there are no issues with bonding if the City wishes to do this in a shorter time frame. Bonding is more complicated in the area outside of existing TIF. Mr. Wilson then reviewed the three options, noting the numbers are the same for Option 1 and 2; however, a decision needs to be made about tying up MFT funds. Option 2's time frame is approximately six months. Discussion ensued regarding the various options presented.

VOTE:

Ald. Woods made a motion, seconded by Ald. Catalano, to approve moving forward with Option 2 and determine if it will qualify for TIF funds. A roll call vote was taken, with the following results:
