ORDINANCE NO. 0-22-006

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF WOOD DALE TRAFFIC CODE ORDINANCE CHAPTER 15, ARTICLE XIII, SECTION 15.1303 OF THE CITY CODE REGARDING STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIC PLACES

WHEREAS, the City of Wood Dale is a body politic and corporate, organized and existing pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wood Dale is authorized and empowered, under Section 11-80-2 of the Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 11-80-2, to regulate the use of streets and the parking of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the ordinance prohibiting parking that extends over any sidewalk should be limited to certain hours of the day.

BE IT HEREAFTER ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Wood Dale, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

- **Section 2**. That the Code of Ordinances of the City Chapter 15, Article XIII, Section 15.1303.A.1 entitled, "Stopping, Standing or Parking Prohibited in Specific Place" shall be amended as provided for herein:
- A. Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device, no person shall:
 - 1. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
 - a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street:
 - b. Extending over a sidewalk except during the hours of 9:00pm to 6:00am;
 - c. Within an intersection;
 - d. On a crosswalk;
 - e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within thirty feet (30') of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone unless a different length is indicated by signs or markings;
 - f. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
 - g. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel;
 - h. On any railroad tracks;
 - j. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping;
 - k. In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers.
 - 2. Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:
 - a. In front of a public or private driveway;

- b. Within fifteen feet (15') of a fire hydrant;
- c. Within sixty feet (60') of a crosswalk at an intersection where a street intersects with Wood Dale Road, Irving Park Road, and Addison Road;
- d. Within twenty feet (20') of a crosswalk at any other intersection;
- e. Within thirty feet (30') upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign or traffic-control signal located at the side of a roadway;
- f. Within twenty feet (20') of the driveway entrance of any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within seventy five feet (75') of such entrance (when properly signposted);
- g. At any place where official signs prohibit standing.
- 3. Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers:
 - a. Within fifty feet (50') of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;
 - b. At any place where official signs prohibit parking.
- B. It shall be unlawful to park on private property without the consent of the owner of the private property or to park in any parking lot which is not licensed according to law.
- C. It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle, trailer/camper, boat or any other recreation vehicle within a single-family, multiple-family, commercial or industrial district at any location other than on a parking area intended as a driveway or other approved parking area as defined in the zoning regulations.
- D. Stopping, standing or parking is prohibited in a public parking area or public street, highway or roadway if the vehicle does not display a current annual State issued registration sticker, license plates or current temporary permit pending registration.
- **Section 3**. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- **Section 4**. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in the manner provided for in Section 65 ILCS 5/5-2-1 *et seq.*
- **Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as required by law.
